

HISTORIC ARCHITECTURE COMMISSION

November 10, 2009

Chairman Ann Parks began the meeting at 7:30 PM.

KATHERINE'S GOURMET CREATIONS 725 Pittsford-Victor Road

Josh Palmer, of Vital Signs and Graphics in Webster, spoke about the proposed new sign for Katherine's Gourmet Creations. The dimensions will be 95 inches by 30 inches, and ¾ inch thick. The store will only be open during the day, so there is no need for any outdoor lighting on the sign. T.C. Lewis said that the proposed sign meets the Planning Board code requirements. The colors will be black and white with a bit of gold to set off the name.

A motion was made by J. Fassanella to accept the submittal for Katherine's Gourmet Creations, drawings received on October 26, 2009, with one correction – the dimensions should read 95 inches by 30 inches, instead of 97 X 30. The motion was seconded by S. Angevine.

OLD BUSINESS

A. Parks e-mailed Tim Howard on Ridgeview and called the Dowdens on Fair Oaks and the Dodgsons on Regency Drive. Ann met with the Dodgsons, who are quite excited about the designation; she has yet to meet with the others. The Commission will try for a January and/or a February designation meeting and perhaps designate four properties at a time.

Jean Keplinger reported that two trees were recently taken down in Mason Road cemetery. The trees were not in good shape, but it looks very barren without them.

T.C. Lewis commented that the dumpsters that were supposed to be at the Fruit and Salad Company in Bushnell's Basin are not there. There are eight large unsightly garbage cans by the side of the building, and that is not what was approved at either the Planning, Zoning or HAC meetings. We need to have the Building Department look into this situation.
