

The Garnsey Arboretum



The Garnsey Arboretum was founded in March 1975. That was the time when certain residents of the Town of Perinton took the initiative in planting trees and developing the area of the Garnsey Arboretum. At this time, the arboretum had only 11 existing trees. In the Spring of 1975, a set of 30 trees and shrubs were planted. On May 21, 1975 a petition was signed by the residents living adjacent to the park. It said that they wanted the park to remain a greenbelt confined to arboretum development, wildlife preservation, and nature trails. Also, a small localized play area for spontaneous and unorganized activities could be created.

At a town meeting on August 1, 1975 it was discussed and agreed upon that the cut and fill in the water detention area will begin that month. Many more trees started getting planted around 1989. Some of these trees would be dedicated to people.
