

The **Crescent Trail** is a system of footpaths within the Town of Perinton suitable for uses such as hiking, cross-country running, snowshoeing, nature study, and photography. Approximately thirty-five miles of footpaths provide public access to wooded hills, Town parklands, scenic overlooks, the margins of wetlands, and other preserved open spaces. The Trail connects with the Erie Canal Trail and the RS&E Trolley Trail.





The **RS&E Trolley Trail**, spans about 5-miles in total from the northwest to the southeast portion of Perinton. The Trail was once a railroad that connected Rochester, Syracuse, and Eastern New York. Perfect for walking, running, and biking year-round, the trail welcomes all skill levels and is wheelchair and stroller accessible. In winter, enjoy skiing and snowshoeing. Connect with the Erie Canal Path for an extended journey from Eyer Park in East Rochester, through Fairport and Egypt, to Pannell Road.





The **Erie Canal Trail** is a scenic journey with captivating scenery and the storied legacy of the Erie Canal. Stretching 360 miles from Butfalo to Albany in Upstate New York, this trail follows historic water and rail routes, offering a flat and off-road ride suitable for walkers and cyclists alike. Connect with our Perinton parks, trails, and local businesses along the way!

CAPITAL PROJECTS



Parking Lot Improvements

Parking lot work was conducted at several of our town parks and facilities, including Parks Operations, Kreag Road Park, Center Park East, Center Park West, Ayrault Road Boat Launch, and Whitebrook Nature Area. Cost: \$67,112 / Funding: ARPA



Perinton Amphitheater

To ensure another successful summer of concerts at the Perinton Amphitheater, upgrades were made to the amphitheater structure, including the installation of several new parts. These enhancements were essential as our Center Stage Concert Series drew an impressive attendance of 20,000.

Cost: \$39,992 / Funding: Capital Reserves



Fellows Road Basketball Courts

The Fellows Road Basketball Courts have recently received essential maintenance, including crack repair and resurfacing. These enhancements were implemented to provide park visitors with an optimal and user-friendly experience.

Cost: \$41,500 / Funding: Capital Reserves



PCC Kitchen Renovation

The recent upgrades to our 55+ Curbside Lunch Program Kitchen have significantly enhanced our food service and storage facilities, resulting in an elevated dining experience for our patrons. In 2023, a total of 21,000 lunches were served.

Cost: \$104,795 / Funding: ARPA & Capital Reserves



Kreag Road Playground

The Kreag Road playground, opened in June, represents the initial phase of the Town's 5-Year Playground Revitalization Plan. Replacing outdated equipment with modern structures, this project introduced a natural color scheme and innovative play elements designed to serve kids of ages, including up to age 12. Cost: \$184,658 / Funding: Special Recreation



Perinton Park & Perinton Skatepark Progress

In addition to the new Skatepark, significant strides have been taken to enhance Perinton Park. This includes the installation of sidewalks connecting the skatepark to existing restrooms and amenities, an expanded parking lot, and a welcoming pedestrian entrance from 31F. These upgrades are designed to enhance accessibility and convenience, ultimately benefiting the entire community of park users.

Budget: \$2,700,000/ Funding: Grants, ARPA & Capital Reserves



Howell Road Disc Golf Course Established

The new Disc Golf Course received Town Board approval after significant time planning, consulting, & collaborating with various stakeholders, including the Conservation Board, Greater Rochester Disc Golf, Crescent Trail Hiking Association, neighbors, and enthusiasts. This will be a new recreational attraction for our town, offering a fun and challenging experience for players of all ages and abilities.

Budget: \$125,000 / Funding: Special Recreation



NEW INITIATIVES



The Town of Perinton established the Kevin Legg Memorial Trust thanks to the Legg Family's generous donation. These funds are earmarked for future basketball-related upgrades to the Perinton Community Center (PCC) Gym. Kevin Legg, who served as President of Eastside Basketball for over 20 years, was known for his dedication to the sport and his collaborative efforts with Town staff to ensure a positive experience for players. His passing in 2017 prompted the creation of this memorial fund.

Perinton Amphitheater has long been a beacon for unforgettable events and concerts. In 2023, Rochester Events seized the opportunity to host ticketed summer concerts featuring nationally-touring bands, and the response was phenomenal! Collective Soul mesmerized 1,991 attendees, while The Wood Brothers captivated 2,177 fans. These shows not only drew crowds from Perinton and neighboring areas but also attracted music enthusiasts from across state lines and even Canada.

Our Accessible Egg Hunt is a community event designed to ensure inclusivity for all participants. This event is tailored to accommodate individuals with all abilities, providing a welcoming environment with sensory-friendly elements and wheelchair-accessible spaces. Through thoughtful planning and collaboration with local organizations, the event promotes a sense of belonging and celebrates diversity within our community.

Accessible Egg Hunt

We've taken significant steps to enhance the accessibility and affordability of programs. Through the Perinton Pride Fund, we're providing more need-based scholarships than ever before. Additionally, in recognition of the financial challenges many families face, we've introduced a Sibling Discount. This discount aims to alleviate some of the financial burden by offering reduced rates for siblings enrolling in our programs, making it easier for families to engage in activities together.

2024 PREVIEW



After several years of collaboration with local advocates, we're excited to unveil the Perinton Skatepark in the spring of 2024. We actively sought community input before the design and site characteristics were determined. Perinton Park will also be enhanced with improved sidewalks, expanded parking, and an updated pedestrian entrance. The project received \$1.5 million in NYS grant funding. Future plans include learn-to-skate programming for participants of all ages and abilities.

Perinton Skatepark & Perinton Park Improvements

A new amenity, the Howell Road Park East Disc Golf Course, is the product of extensive collaboration with stakeholders. This space will feature 19 holes seamlessly integrated into the natural environment. Ongoing coordination between Perinton Recreation & Parks, Greater Rochester Disc Golf, and local resident/course designer Jason Phelps ensures a top-notch experience. The plan is to reveal 6-9 holes by the fall of 2024, with the full 19-hole course ready by the summer of 2025.

Splash party reservations will be streamlined to make the process more efficient and customer focused.
