Ways to Keep the Spotter Safe

- Never walk behind equipment and spot at the same time. Stand at the desired area and direct the equipment to you.
- Agree on hand signals prior to spotting.
- In the case of vehicles, if you can't see the mirrors, the operator can't see you!
- Review work area for hazards prior to moving any equipment. Remove people, trip hazards and equipment prior to the move.
- Wear proper reflective PPE.
- Operators: IF YOU LOOSE SIGHT OF THE SPOTTER – STOP!
